October

Civic Education Essay contest opens

- **Civic Education Week Essay Contest** All YES students are encouraged to apply to the Civic Education Week Essay Contest. Application materials for the contest will be distributed in the fall and include the general application form, an essay requirement, and a letter of recommendation. Students compete to win an all-expense paid, week long trip to Washington DC during the second semester.

November 1

Complete 7.5 Hours of community service to be on track for the year (25 hours for the 100+ hr prize)

- YES students are required to complete a minimum of 30 hours of volunteer community service throughout the academic year. Students who complete over 100+ hours of community service will receive an award recognizing this accomplishment. Students are required to log/track their volunteer hours.

November 14-18

International Education Week

- International Education Week is a joint initiative of the U.S. Department of State and the U.S. Department of Education. It is part of their efforts to promote programs that prepare Americans for a global environment and attract future leaders from abroad to study, learn, and exchange experiences in the United States. Before departing from their home countries, students are asked to begin preparing a presentation about their country. Many students bring flags, ethnic costumes, music and food from home to share during their presentations. Students are required to make at least one presentation during IEW but are encouraged to present multiple times. Presentations can be made to a variety of audiences, including classmates, church groups, community groups and the student's extended host family.



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January 1

Complete 7.5 Hours of community service to be on track for the year (25 hours for the 100+ hr prize)

- YES students are required to complete a minimum of 30 hours of volunteer community service throughout the academic year. Students who complete over 100+ hours of community service will receive an award recognizing this accomplishment. Students are required to log/track their volunteer hours.

February 15

March 1

- YES students are required to complete a minimum of 30 hours of community service throughout the academic year. Students who complete over 100+ hours of community service will receive an award recognizing this accomplishment. Students are required to log/track their volunteer hours.

Mid-May

End of Year Survey & Re-Entry Meeting

- YES students are required to complete the DOS end of the year survey. The Department of State designs the survey to gather information on the students' progress during their year-long program. Surveys will be provided at the end of the academic year and students are required to complete and submit them by the established deadline. Once the surveys are made available, ARs are required to send them to the students and ensure that they complete and submit them as required.
- Re-entry meetings ensure that students receive relevant information concerning alumni opportunities in their respective countries.

YES Return Travel to Home Countries

- YES students and host families will receive a Return Travel Request date choice at the end of the first semester/beginning of second semester. They will have the opportunity to request a preferred departure date based on the available international flights specific to each country. YES students are strongly encouraged to consult with their natural parents before deciding on a preferred departure date to find out if the student has exam obligations in the home country.
- **Return Travel:** Review travel packet contents and itineraries, excess baggage limitations, and getting to the airport on time.
